

- DUNCAN, CAPT. J. C. Drowned in Napa Creek, April 12, 1861, Captain J. C. Duncan, aged 35 years. Boston papers please copy. Paper: April 22, 1861.
- DUNCAN, MARY ELLEN In San Francisco, March 17, 1861, Mary Ellen, daughter of James and J. Maria Duncan, aged 2 years and 5 months. Paper: March 18, 1861.
- DUNIGAN, ANN In Sacramento, Feb. 13, 1861, Ann, daughter of Margaret and the late Mathew Dunigan, aged 5 years and 6 months. Paper: Feb. 19, 1861.
- DUNLAY, HERMAN At Michigan Bluff, April 7, 1861, Herman Dunlay, aged 30 years, a native of Virginia. Paper: April 16, 1861.
- DUNN, GEORGE In San Francisco, March 4, 1861, George Dunn, a native of Kings County, Ireland, aged 40 years. Paper: March 5, 1861.
- DUNN, GEORGE A. Died at sea on board the P. & O. Co. steamer --- bound from Singapore to Bangkok on the 12th day of January, 1861, George A. Dunn, aged 39 years. Mr. Dunn was long a resident of San Francisco and was the pioneer in the rice-cleaning business, having established the first mill in California in 1852, and left here in June 1858 to engage in the same business in Siam.
